Hugo Chávez Frías 1954-2013

- Jul 28, 1954: Hugo Rafael Chávez Frías born in Sabaneta. Venezuela
- 1971-75: Studies at Venezuelan Academy of Military Sciences. Develops doctrine that military should act against corrupt politicians
- 1982: Founds Revolutionary Bolivarian Movement-200 (MBR-200) - secretive cell within military, inspired by visionary Simón Bolívar
- 1992: Jailed after leading failed coup against President Carlos Pérez
- 1994: Pardoned by President Rafael Caldera
- 1997: Founds Fifth Republic Movement.
- pledging social and economic reform 1998: Wins presidential election
- with 56% of vote



with 63% of vote

1999: Launches Plan Bolívar massive social welfare programme adopts new constitution, changes country's name to **Bolivarian Republic** of Venezuela

- 2000: Re-elected president. Gradually places state institutions under his personal control. Signs oil-for-medics deal with Cuba
- 2002: Survives attempted coup
- 2006: Re-elected president

- 2009: Referendum abolishes two-term limit, allowing Chávez to run for office indefinitely
- Jun-Jul 2011: Undergoes cancer treatment in Cuba
- Oct 2012: Wins fourth term as president with 55% of vote
- Dec: Chávez returns to Cuba
- for cancer treatment, names Vice-President Nicolas Maduro as his heir apparent
- Feb 2013: Returns to Venezuela
- Mar 5: President Hugo Chávez dies aged 58, after losing his long battle with cancer
