Timeline of hostilities on Korean sea border

North Korea has threatened to "wipe out" a South Korean island as Pyongyang comes under renewed economic and diplomatic pressure from U.S. sanctions and UN charges of gross human rights abuses



FATAL INCIDENTS

- Jan 1967: South Korean (SK) navy ship *Dangpo* sunk by North Korean (NK) coastal artillery north of Northern Limit Line, 39 sailors killed
- Jun 1999: NK ships escort fishing boats into disputed waters, firing on SK patrol boats when challenged. One NK torpedo boat lost, 30 sailors killed
- Jun 2002: Two NK patrol boats cross Northern Limit Line near Yeonpyeong island. Four SK sailors killed. NK casualties unknown

- Nov 2009: NK gunboat enters SK waters off *Daecheong* island. Battle ensues with five SK ships. NK vessel badly damaged, 1 sailor dies
 - Mar 2010: SK navy ship *Cheonan* sunk by explosion off *Baengnyeong*, killing 46 sailors. NK denies involvement. Investigation concludes NK torpedo attack responsible
- Nov 2010: NK forces fire shells and rockets at Yeonpyeong, killing four people
