Key dates in Amanda Knox prosecution





- Nov 1, 2007: British student Meredith Kercher (1) killed at her apartment in Perugia. Police find her a day later
- Nov 6: Kercher's U.S. housemate Amanda Knox (2) arrested with thenboyfriend Raffaele Sollecito (3) and Patrick Diya Lumumba – Congolese owner of bar where Knox occasionally worked
- Nov 20: Ivory Coast national Rudy Hermann Guede (4) detained in Germany – later extradited to Italy. Lumumba released without charge
- Oct 28, 2008: Guede sentenced to 30 years in prison after fast-track trial. Knox and Sollecito indicted on charges of murder and sexual assault
- Jan 16, 2009: Trial of Knox and Sollecito opens in Perugia





- Dec 4: Knox and Sollecito found guilty on both counts, and jailed for 26 and 25 years respectively
- Dec 22: Appeals court upholds
 Guede's conviction but cuts sentence
- Nov 24, 2010: Appeals trial for Knox and Sollecito opens
- Jun 29, 2011: Forensic report ordered by appeals court finds much of DNA evidence used to convict Knox and Sollecito is unreliable
- Oct 3: Knox and Sollecito acquitted. Knox returns to U.S.
- Mar 26, 2013: Italy's highest court overturns acquittals orders third trial
- Jan 30, 2014: Defendants found guilty for second time. Knox's sentence increased to 28 years and six months
