▲ **Libya accepted responsibility for the 1998 bombing of Pan Am Flight 103 over Lockerbie, Scotland, which killed 270 people, as a prelude to lifting sanctions**

1945: Adolf Hitler and Eva Braun, his wife of one day, committed suicide in his underground bunker in Berlin

1973: U.S. President Richard Nixon accepting responsibility for the bugging of the Watergate complex in 1972
