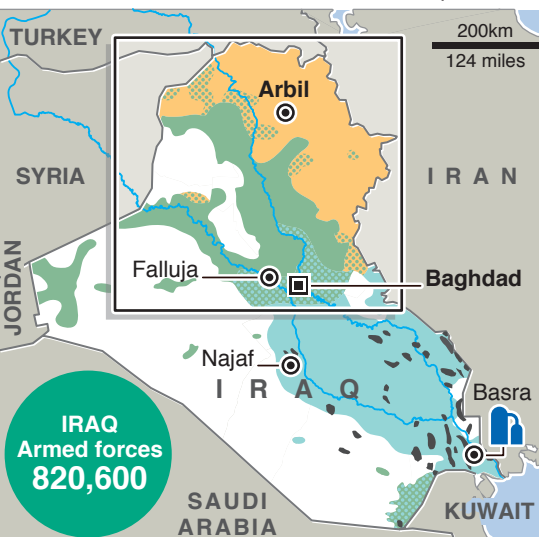
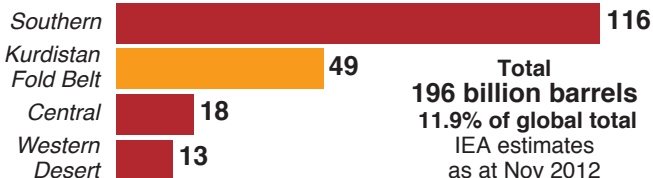


# Oil wealth fuels tensions in Iraq's north

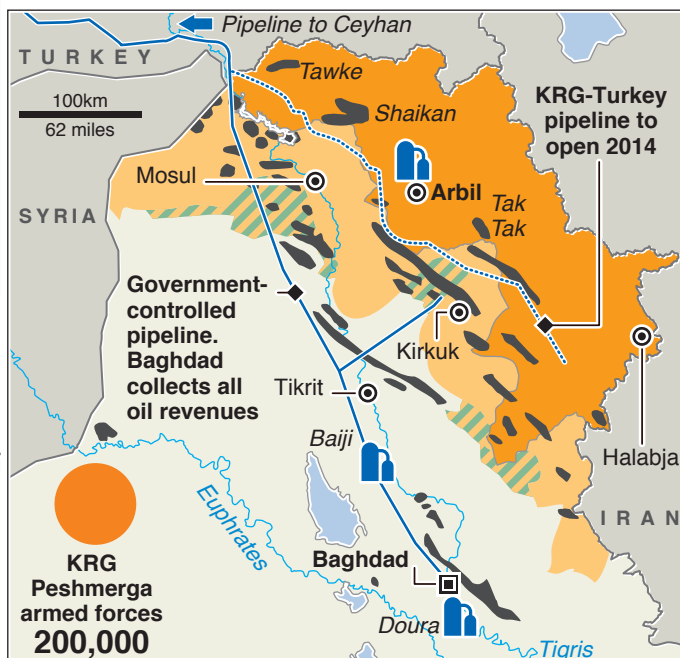
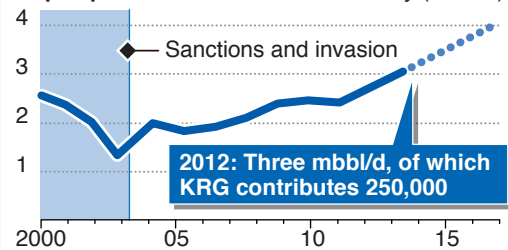
Disputes over oil production, power sharing and territorial control has led both Iraq's central government and the Kurdistan Regional Government (KRG) to deploy thousands of troops and heavy weapons along their disputed internal border
