
## **UN warns of Mali risk to Western Sahara**

UN leader Ban Ki-Moon has warned that the conflict in Mali could spill over into Western Sahara, where Morocco and the Polisario Front have been locked in a more than two-decade dispute over control



## HISTORY OF WESTERN SAHARA CONFLICT

- ▶ 1975: Morocco takes control of most of Western Sahara as colonial power Spain withdraws
- ▶ 1976: Polisario Front backed by Algeria wages guerrilla war against Moroccan army
- ▶ 1991: UN brokers ceasefire and sends in peacekeeping mission known as *MINURSO*. Truce includes promise of referendum on self-determination, with independence as one option
  - ➤ 2003 onwards: Several rounds of UN-sponsored talks fail to achieve political solution. Polisario Front insists on right of Saharawi people to referendum. Morocco only agrees to broader autonomy
- ▶ April 2013: UN warns that Mali fighting could spill over into neighbouring countries and contribute to radicalization of refugee camps around Tindouf

Polisario Front proclaimed Saharawi Arab Democratic Republic (SADR) in 1976, with government headed by Mohamed Abdelaziz in exile in Tindouf, Algeria
