Recent governments in Italy













1 Apr 2000: *Giuliano Amato* takes office at head of centre-left coalition

2 Jun 2001: Silvio Berlusconi forms new coalition government that includes two right-wing parties

- Apr 2005: Coalition collapses after crushing defeat in regional polls Berlusconi resigns but days later receives presidential mandate to form 60th post-war government
- 3 Apr 2006: Centre-left leader Romano Prodi wins closely-fought general election

4 Jan 2008: Prodi resigns after losing vote of confidence. Berlusconi wins general election, securing third term as Prime Minister in April

- 5 Nov 2011: As doubts grow over Italy's debt burden, Berlusconi resigns after failing to secure majority in vote on public finance in lower house. Former EU commissioner *Mario Monti* nominated to form government of technocrats
- Dec 2012: Berlusconi's party withdraws support from Monti's government parliament dissolved
- Feb 2013: General election produces stalemate between centre-right and centre-left blocs
- 6 Apr 24: Enrico Letta, deputy head of centre-left Democratic Party, invited by President to head grand coalition
