June 4, 1993

▲ The UN agreed to send troops to Bosnia to protect six “safe havens”, including Srebrenica, where 8,000 Bosnian Muslims were murdered in 1995

1913: British suffragette Emily Davison was killed when she ran in front of the King's horse at the Derby

1988: Sir Douglas Ralph Nicholls, the first aborigine to govern an Australian state, died aged 81

2003: Liberian President Charles Taylor was indicted by a war crimes tribunal in connection with the war in Sierra Leone

2008: Work began to reassemble a historic obelisk in Ethiopia's city of Axum, after its return from Italy
