▲ **Norwegian explorer Roald Amundsen, the first man to reach the South Pole, died in a plane crash in the Arctic in an attempt to rescue another explorer**

1993: Researchers claimed five women athletes at the 1992 Barcelona Olympics had male genes

1997: Princess Diana visited Mother Teresa in New York. Within three months both women were dead

2000: Tiger Woods won the 100th U.S. Open golf championship at Pebble Beach, California, by a record margin

2009: A plane flying 247 people from Brussels to the U.S. landed safely after the pilot died in mid-flight
