▲ **Former president Juan Peron returned to Argentina after 18 years in exile. He was re-elected as president for a third term the following October**

1756: Over 140 British soldiers were imprisoned in what became known as the Black Hole of Calcutta

1983: U.S. tennis star John McEnroe began arguing with an umpire on the first day of Wimbledon

1990: South Africa's ANC leader Nelson Mandela received a ticker-tape welcome to New York

1995: Shell decided not to dump the disused Brent Spar oil platform in the North Atlantic after huge protests
