

Whistleblowers indicted in U.S.



Daniel Ellsberg: Military analyst



analyst convicted in 1985 for passing secret photographs of Soviet ships to magazine. Pardoned 2001

Lawrence Franklin: Defence Department employee charged in 2005 with passing classified information on Iran to two pro-Israel lobbyists. Ten months house arrest

Shamai Leibowitz: FBI translator monitoring wiretaps of Israeli embassy found guilty in 2009 of leaking information to blogger. Sentenced to 20 months in prison

Thomas Drake: NSA official accused in 2010 of leaking information about waste in surveillance programme. Charges dropped after he pleaded guilty to misdemeanour

Stephen Kim: U.S. State Department contract analyst indicted in 2010 for leaking nuclear information about North Korea to Fox News. Awaiting trial

Bradley Manning: Army private first class accused in 2010 of passing over 700,000 classified files to WikiLeaks in biggest leak of secrets in U.S. history. On trial

◀ Jeffrey Sterling: Former CIA officer charged in 2011 with leaking information to reporter about efforts to sabotage Iran's nuclear programme. Awaiting trial

John Kiriakou: Former CIA officer convicted in 2012 of divulging information about CIA interrogation methods, including waterboarding. Jailed for 30 months
