

Key players in Egypt after Morsi exit

■ **Muslim Brotherhood: Freedom and Justice Party** – Brotherhood's political wing – has called on Egyptians to stage "uprising" after at least 51 were killed in shooting outside Cairo's Republican Guard headquarters, where ousted President **Mohammed Morsi** is being held



■ **General Abdel Fattah al-Sisi:** Appointed head of armed forces by Morsi in 2012, replacing Field Marshall **Mohamed Tantawi** – who was close to **Hosni Mubarak**. Devout Muslim with close relationship with U.S. military, Sisi turned on Morsi in apparent effort to avoid chaos

■ **Tamarod "rebellion":** Grassroots group of liberals, leftists and youth organisations which spearheaded protests against Mubarak in 2011. Mobilised millions with petition calling for Morsi to step down but lacks clear leadership



■ **Nour party:** Ultra-conservative Salafist party has pulled out of talks on caretaker government in wake of shooting "massacre"

■ **Mohamed ElBaradei:** Chosen by **National Salvation Front** – alliance of liberal and leftwing parties – to negotiate with army in run-up to Morsi's overthrow. Islamists reject his appointment as interim premier



■ **Adli Mansour:** Former head of Supreme Constitutional Court sworn in as interim president after removal of Morsi. Judiciary clashed with Morsi several times during his year in office
