
The People's Party (PP) is alleged to have operated a slush fund from which Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy and other party leaders benefited



LUIS BARCENAS Former PP treasurer from 1990 to 2009 Jailed in June on bribery and tax evasion charges. Prosecutors sav he hid up to \$62m in Swiss bank accounts

- Barcenas has testified that he ran secret slush fund through which illegal donations from construction companies were funnelled to senior PP figures, including Rajoy
- Barcenas left party in 2009 but remained on PP's payroll until scandal broke in January

- Rajov received \$34,000 annually between 1997-2008 from alleged slush fund. El Pais newspaper savs
- Rajov, who says he made mistake in trusting Barcenas, admits sending supportive text messages to him two months after scandal broke
- Raiov and other PP members deny receiving illegal payments and accuse Barcenas of trying to blackmail them
