▲ **Three days after an earthquake devastated Mexico City, 58 new-born babies were rescued alive from the rubble of a hospital maternity ward**

1972: Idi Amin ordered 8,000 resident Asians to leave Uganda within 48 hours

1997: Shoichi Yokoi, a Japanese soldier who stayed in the jungles of Guam for 26 years after WW2, died

2003: The Ward Hunt Ice Shelf, the biggest in the Arctic, was reported to have broken up after 3,000 years

2008: China revealed that over 50,000 children had been affected by being given baby milk and infant formula adulterated with melamine
