West to secure Central African Republic aid

- March 2013: Central African
 Republic (CAR) descends into chaos
 after Seleka rebel coalition seizes
 capital, Bangui, and ousts President
 Francois Bozize (right)
- Mar 24: Seleka leader *Michel Djotodia* (far right) declares himself interim president until elections in 2016. New regime proves powerless to stem waves of looting and killing
- Jun-Aug: Security situation deteriorates, with renewed fighting between Seleka and Bozize supporters, and reports of human rights abuses by both sides





- Aug: African Union bolsters existing peacekeeping effort in CAR force to number 3,600 by Jan 2014
- Sep 25: France calls for UN Security Council to adopt resolution to boost UN operations in CAR. Western diplomats commit to urgent buildup of peacekeeping force
