Turkey unveils refoms

Turkish Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdogan has announced long-awaited political reforms to improve human rights



- and other smaller parties to enter parliament to be reduced from 10% to 5% of national vote
- Towns officially allowed to use Kurdish rather than Turkish names
- Teaching in Kurdish and other non-Turkish languages permitted in private schools
- Ban on women wearing Islamic headscarves in public institutions lifted, except in judiciary and army
- Anti-discrimination commission to combat hate crimes to be set up
- Removal of nationalist oath recited by students in primary schools
- Land belonging to Syriac Christian Mor Gabriel Monastery, which was seized by state, to be returned
