November 8, 1895

▲ **William Roentgen discovered electro-magnetic rays, which he called X-rays, in an experiment with the flow of electricity through a partially evacuated glass tube**

1793: The revolutionary government in France opened the royal art collection in the Louvre to the public

1955: Australia's Immigration Minister welcomed the country's one-millionth post-war migrant

1972: West and East Germany signed a good-neighbour treaty, ending 23 years of Cold War antagonism

1993: Eight works by Picasso and Braque, worth \$60 million, were stolen from a Stockholm museum
