New push for Antarctic marine reserves

A long-awaited deal to create the world's largest marine sanctuary in Antarctica could soon be approved. Nations that regulate Antarctic fishing meet in Australia to discuss a new, smaller proposal, hoping to secure the agreement of Russia, which has so far vetoed the plans


