▲ The Millau viaduct, the world's tallest bridge, opened in southern France. The soaring, 343m-high structure spans the Tarn valley in the Massif Central mountains

1913: Greece formally annexed the island of Crete

1995: The leaders of Serbia, Croatia and Bosnia signed the Bosnia Peace Accord in Paris, formally ending Europe's fiercest conflict since WWII

2003: Venice's famed 18th century opera house, La Fenice, rose again seven years after being gutted by fire

2012: A gunman rampaged through a Connecticut primary school, killing 20 children and six adults
