

World offers help to the Philippines


International aid agencies and countries are rushing in supplies and personnel in the aftermath of Typhoon Haiyan that killed an estimated 10,000 people and displaced more than 660,000 others



Philippines

■ **Australia:** US\$9.3 million package, including medical personnel

■ **New Zealand:** \$1.8 million in aid

■ **Britain:** £15 million (\$24 million) including temporary shelter for 500,000 people. **HMS Daring**, with equipment to make drinking water from seawater, en route

■ **Japan:** \$10 million in aid plus 25-strong emergency medical team

■ **Indonesia:** Sending aircraft, logistical aid including personnel, drinking water, food, medication

■ **United States:** \$20 million in aid. Aircraft carrier **USS George Washington** en route. USAID is sending emergency shelters and 55 tonnes of emergency food

■ **European Union:** \$11 million in aid

■ **China:** \$200,000 in cash

■ **Vatican:** \$4 million in aid

■ **Médecins Sans Frontières:** 200 tonnes of medical and relief items

■ **UNICEF:** \$1.3 million worth of aid including water purification tablets

■ **World Food Programme:** 44 tonnes of high-energy biscuits
