Leaders among Ukraine's protesters

Ukraine's biggest protests since the 2004 Orange Revolution have lacked a leader with the organising skills of Yulia Tymoshenko. However, several figures have emerged as challengers to President Viktor Yanukovich



- 1 Yulia Tymoshenko: Jailed former prime minister called for protests after President Viktor Yanukovich scrapped key trade pact with European Union. Tymoshenko was sentenced to seven years in prison in 2011 for abuse of authority. On hunger strike to support protests
- 2 Arseniv Yatseniuk: Leader of Tymoshenko's Fatherland Party. One of Ukraine's most experienced politicians having served as acting head of central bank, foreign and economy minister. Supports EU membership. Party won 25.5% in 2012 parliamentary elections







- 3 Vitali Klitschko: Heavyweight world boxing champion and leader of UDAR (Punch) political party has emerged as leading challenger to Yanukovich in 2015 presidential elections. In November, Yanukovichled Party of Regions passed bill that could prevent Klitschko from standing because he has residency status in Germany.
