

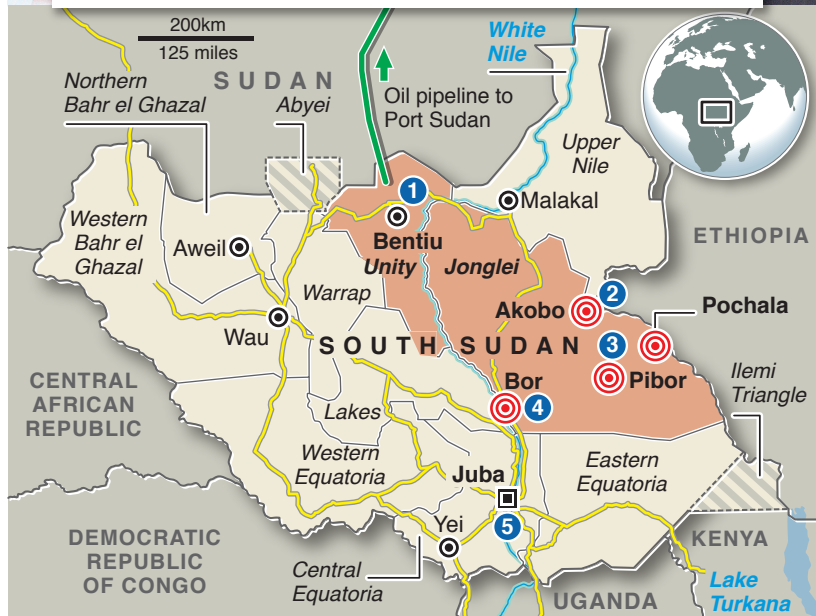
# Rebels hold key South Sudan oil city

South Sudan's government, led by **President Salva Kiir** (right), has lost control of the capital of oil-rich Unity State. The city of Bentiu is now in the hands of rebel troops loyal to former vice-president **Riek Machar** (left). South Sudan gets nearly 99% of its government budget from oil revenues and pumps about 250,000 barrels a day

**1 Bentiu:** Gen. John Koang defects to rebels with army division. 5,000 people sheltering at UN base

**2 Akobo:** Two Indian peacekeepers and up to 20 Dinka civilians killed at UN compound on December 19

**3 Pibor:** At least 2,000 sheltering at UN compound

**4 Bor:** Fierce clashes between army and rebels, summary executions. 15,000 people sheltering at UN compound, 3,000 foreign nationals remain in city

**5 Juba:** Scramble to flee capital as fears of rebel attack grow. 20,000 civilians at two main UN missions
