President Viktor Yanukovych decides to back out of trade deal with European Union in favour of closer ties with Moscow

Nov 21. 2013:

- Nov 30: Police launch violent crackdown in Kiev, detaining dozens of anti-government protesters
- Dec 17: Russia agrees to buy \$15 billion of Ukrainian bonds and cut price of natural gas to Ukraine
- Jan 22, 2014: Two protesters die from gunshot wounds during clashes with police in Kiev. Protests spread to cities across Ukraine

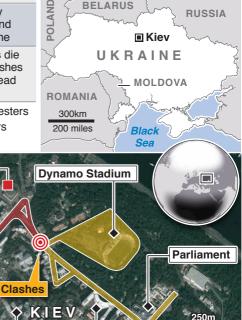
