
Americans want improved relations with Cuba

A strong majority of Americans support normalising relations with Cuba, the Cold War-era foe that remains subject to a 50-year economic embargo



- 1898: Spanish-American War ushers in period of U.S. dominance in Cuba
- 1953: Fidel Castro fails to overthrow U.S.-backed government of Fulgencio Batista
- 1959: Castro and Che Guevara overthrow Batista and form new aovernment
- 1960: Castro seizes U.S.-owned businesses in Cuba. U.S. severs diplomatic relations and imposes trade embargo

to invade Cuba. Cuba turns to communism and Soviet Union 1962: Cuban Missile Crisis leads to nuclear stand-off between U.S.

1961: U.S. backs

- and Soviet Union 1980: Castro relaxes emigration law, 125,000 Cubans flee to Florida in Mariel Boatlift
- 1996: Cuba shoots down two civilian planes piloted by anti-Castro Cubans in exile

- 2001: U.S. food exports to Cuba allowed as part of recovery from Hurricane Michelle
- 2002: U.S. military base at Guantanamo Bay used as prison for terrorist suspects
- 2006: Castro suffers serious health problems and hands day-to-day power to his brother. Raul - who becomes president in 2008 2013: Barack Obama
