
Parliament: Working to form unity government, to provide authority until presidential election on May 25

■ Eastern Ukraine: Leaders of mainly Russian-speaking regions question legitimacy of new parliament

Crimea: Staunchly pro-Russian region could be annexed by Moscow if country splits apart
