Interim president ready to talk to Russia, but will focus on closer integration with European Union

Parliament: Working to form unity government, to provide authority until presidential election on May 25

Police: Seeking arrest of toppled president **Viktor Yanukovych** for "mass murder" of protesters

EU: Ready to conclude trade deal with Ukraine and offer aid once new government is in place

U.S.: Has warned Russia not to send troops into Ukraine

Whereabouts not known. Reportedly last seen in Crimea

Moscow: Condemns removal of Yanukovych. Has recalled Ukraine ambassador for consultations on "deteriorating situation" in Kiev

Sergei Lavrov: Russian foreign minister says Ukrainian opposition "seized power" by force, ignoring EU-brokered truce that would have kept Yanukovych in office

Eastern Ukraine: Leaders of mainly Russian-speaking regions question legitimacy of new parliament

Crimea: Staunchly pro-Russian region could be annexed by Moscow if country splits apart
