1945: Dachau concentration camp was liberated by U.S. troops. Over 30,000 people died at the camp over 12 years

1977: Trades unions were legalised in Spain after being outlawed by General Franco in 1936

2004: The final Oldsmobile rolled off General Motors' assembly line, 103 years after the debut of the first model

2006: A miniature portrait that survived the sinking of the Titanic sold at auction for \$100,000
