May 28, 1934

▲ The first surviving quintuplets were born in Ontario, Canada. The five identical Dionne sisters grew up in a purpose-built nursery, observed by 6,000 tourists a day

1905: In the Russo-Japanese war the Russian Baltic Fleet was destroyed at the Battle of Tsushima, one of the most important naval events since Trafalgar

1940: Evacuation of the defeated Allied armies from Dunkirk began

1964: The first National Covenant of the Palestine Liberation Organization was drafted in Jerusalem

1999: Leonardo da Vinci's Last Supper went on show to the public in Milan for the first time in 20 years
