▲ U.S. tennis star Michael Chang, 17, became the youngest ever Grand Slam champion, defeating Stefan Edberg of Sweden to win the title at Roland Garros

1955: Eighty-three people died when two cars collided at Le Mans racetrack and ploughed into spectators

1963: John F. Kennedy proposed a civil rights bill that would outlaw discrimination based on colour, race, religion, sex or national origin

1969: Singer-songwriter David Bowie released his single Space Oddity

2008: Dethroned King Gyanendra left the royal palace for the last time after Nepal was declared a republic
