

Accidents at Brazil's World Cup stadiums

Stadium construction for this summer's World Cup soccer tournament has been beset by accidents and missed deadlines, with eight workers dying as Brazil rushes to complete all 12 venues on time

■ **Jun 11, 2012:** Builder killed after falling 30 metres during construction of **Estadio Nacional** in capital, Brasilia

■ **Mar 28, 2013:** Worker dies from severe head injuries after falling five metres at **Arena Amazonia** site in Manaus

■ **Oct 25:** Fire breaks out at Cuiaba's **Arena Pantanal**, damaging steel and concrete structure in basement area

■ **Nov 27:** Two builders killed by crane collapse at **Arena Corinthians** in Sao Paulo – venue for World Cup opener

■ **Dec 14:** Another worker falls to his death at Manaus stadium

■ **Feb 7, 2014:** Third worker dies at Manaus site after being struck by metal bar while dismantling crane used to install roof



■ **Mar 29:** Worker dies after falling eight metres while helping to install temporary seats at Sao Paulo stadium

■ **May 8:** Telecoms engineer killed by electric shock at Arena Pantanal, temporarily halting construction work
