▲ **Colombian soccer player Andres Escobar, who scored an own goal that eliminated Colombia from the World Cup, was shot dead on his return to Medellin**

2000: Vicente Fox became Mexico's first president from the opposition PAN party, ousting the PRI after 71 years

2004: The Cassini spacecraft transmitted its first close-up images of Saturn's giant moon Titan

2009: India's 148-year old colonial law banning homosexual intercourse was overturned by the country's High Court

2013: Doug Engelbart, U.S. inventor of the computer mouse, died at the age of 88
