- Ahmad Chalabi: America-educated former leader of exiled *Iraqi National Congress* was favourite among neoconservatives calling for 2003 invasion. After rift with Washington over bogus intelligence sources, American policymakers are once again reaching out to Chalabi. Age: 70
- Bayan Jabr: Former Interior Minister. Accused of turning Iraq's police into Shia death squads
- Hakim al-Zamili: Outsider from political bloc loyal to anti-U.S. cleric *Muqtada al-Sadr*
