

Turkey to advance peace plan with Kurdish militants

Turkey's government is in the process of completing a reform bill aimed at bringing to an end a three-decade insurgency by the Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK), which has resulted in the deaths of over 40,000 people

- 1978: PKK formally established by Kurdish political science student Abdullah Ocalan as covert Marxist group
- **1984:** PKK takes up arms with aim of creating ethnic Kurdish homeland in southeast Turkey

- IRAQ 2004-2007: PKK ends ceasefire. Turkish army wages offensive against rebel hideouts in northern Iraa
- 2009: Government announces "Kurdish initiative" package promoting minority rights and reducing military presence in southeast Turkey
- 1992: Turkish army launches first major cross-border operation against PKK in northern Iraq 1999: Ocalan captured and
- sentenced to death for treason. PKK declares ceasefire and drops demands for independent state in favour of more autonomy
- 2002: Ocalan's death sentence commuted to life imprisonment
- 2003: Recep Tayyip Erdogan elected prime minister, pushes agenda granting Kurds more cultural and language rights
