U.S. intelligence officials are concerned that Al-Qaeda's top bombmaker

is developing a bomb that could go undetected through airport security

Apr 1982: Ibrahim Hassan al-Asiri born into military family in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. Al-Asiri has four brothers and three sisters 2007: Al-Asiri and younger brother, Abdullah, join Al-Qaeda in Yemen 1982 Al-Asiri. known 2007 bv alias Jan 2009: Abu Saleh Al Qaeda's Yemeni 2008 and Saudi wings merge into Al Qaeda in the Arabian Dec 2009: Christmas Day Peninsula (AQAP). bomber, Umar Farouk 2009 Aug: Attempted assassination of Abdulmutallab.
