Countdown to appoint EU's top jobs

A new EU leadership trio will emerge at the July 14-17 summit with the confirmation of Jean-Claude Juncker as Commission President and nominations revealed for Council President and foreign affairs chief



European Commission President: Jean-Claude Juncker of centre-right European People's Party nominated by EU leaders for top job. President will run Brussels bureaucracy and wield new powers to screen national budgets following eurozone debt crisis. Nomination was opposed by Britain



European Council President: Expectations that job will go to centreleft Party of European Socialists blocked by German chancellor, Angela Merkel. Potential candidates now include Mark Rutte (above), Dutch prime minister, Andrus Ansip (Estonia), Enda Kenny (Ireland), Jyrki
