
Iraq says rebels have seized nuclear material

Iraq has told the UN that insurgents have seized nuclear materials from a university in the north of the country, and has appealed for help to "stave off the threat of their use by terrorists in Iraq or abroad"



- 1 Mosul University: Almost 40kg of uranium compounds used for scientific research seized by rebels. UN atomic agency says it believes nuclear material is low grade and does not pose significant security risk
- 2 Khalis: Islamic State insurgents in control of Sudur dam following clashes with Iraqi government forces
- Irbil: Iraqi Prime Minister Nouri al-Maliki has said semi-autonomous Kurdish capital is becoming base for Islamic State fighters
- 4 Muthanna: Rebels control site housing remnants of deadly chemical agents. UN and U.S. say weapons are degraded and unusable for making chemical arms
