▲ The warring factions agreed on principles for peace in Bosnia, a significant step towards ending Europe's worst conflict since World War II

1504: Michelangelo's David, a masterpiece of Renaissance sculpture, was unveiled in Florence

1664: The Dutch surrendered New Amsterdam to the British, who renamed it New York

1994: The last U.S., British and French troops left Berlin after occupying the once-divided city for nearly 50 years

2007: The Red Cross recovered the bodies of 11 Colombian legislators shot dead by FARC rebels in June
