A South African appeals court has convicted Olympic athlete Oscar Pistorius of murder, overturning an earlier manslaughter conviction for shooting girlfriend Reeva Steenkamp to death in 2013

- Nov 22, 1986: Oscar Pistorius born in Johannesburg, South Africa. Without fibulas (calf bones) since birth, he had both legs amputated below knee before age of one
- 2001: His mother, Sheila, dies after adverse reaction to medication
- 2003: A keen sportsman at school, he turns to sprinting after suffering serious knee injury playing rugby



- 2004: Running on carbon fibre prosthetic "cheetah blades", wins 200m gold at Athens Paralympics, setting world record time
- Jan 2008: Banned by IAAF from competing against able-bodied athletes due to "unfair advantage". Ruling overturned in May by Court of Arbitration for Sport

- Aug 2008: Wins three gold medals at Beijing Paralympics
- 2011: Helps South Africa to relay final at IAAF World Championships
- 2012: Becomes first double amputee to compete at Olympic Games. Wins two golds and a silver at London Paralympics

Feb 14, 2013
Arrested and charged with shooting dead his 29-year-old girlfriend Reeva Steenkamp.
Pistorius claims he

mistook her for an intruder

- Sep 12, 2014: Following six-month trial, Pistorius found guilty of culpable homicide (manslaughter)
 - Oct 21: Jailed for five years
- Oct 20, 2015: Released to serve rest of sentence under house arrest
- Dec 3: Found guilty of murder
