Catalonia eyes independence referendum

Catalonia is heading for a showdown with the Spanish government over the wealthy industrial region's plan to hold a nonbinding referendum on independence on November 9



COUNTDOWN TO REFERENDUM

- 2006: Reformed version of Catalonia's autonomy statute, giving regional government greater powers, comes into force
- 2010: Constitutional Court in Madrid strikes down key provisions of statute in response to complaint by Spanish centre-right People's Party. Court rules there is no legal basis for recognising Catalonia as nation
- Sep 2012: 1.5m people take part in independence rally in Barcelona

ANDORRA

- Jan 2013: Sovereignty declaration adopted by Catalan parliament
- Apr 2014: Spanish parliament votes against transferring referendum powers to Catalonia
- Sep: Hundreds of thousands of Catalans form "V" for "vote" along two of Barcelona's main roads calling for their right to vote
 - Sep 27: President Artur Mas signs decree calling for vote on independence from Spain – central government expected to seek court injunction blocking referendum scheduled for Nov 9
