POROSHENKO BLOC

Comprises Solidarity party of President Petro Poroshenko, and UDAR (Ukrainian Democratic Alliance for Reform) led by former boxer Vitaly Klitschko. Expected to win most seats and form government with other reformist parties

BATKIVSHCHYNA (FATHERLAND)

Party of former Prime Minister Yulia Tymoshenko hit by recent highprofile defections. Has made joining NATO its major election issue

Appealing to former Party of Regions electorate. Group founded by Serhiy Lvovochkin (right), chief of staff under former president Viktor Yanukovych
