

# China rolls out sweeping measures for APEC

Beijing is ramping up security and taking drastic anti-pollution measures ahead of the arrival of world leaders for the culmination of the APEC summit, deemed the city's biggest event since the 2008 Olympics

**Hotels:** Asked to report to police any guests from (1) Xinjiang, (2) Tibet and (3) Qinghai provinces during APEC summit

**Huairou district:** Around 1,000 new facial-recognition cameras to cover densely populated areas

**International Airport:** People could face jail for flying pet pigeons or kites near airport

**Hebei province:** Production at over 800 factories suspended and several construction sites closed during APEC

■ Half of Beijing's cars banned on alternate days, according to odd/even number plates, from Nov 3-12

■ Cargo trains to remove cars of holidaymakers out of Beijing

■ Government workers, including teachers, given six-day vacations

**Tianjin's economic and development zone:**

Switching on of winter heating, powered by burning coal, postponed until after APEC

■ People banned from registering marriages

■ Mortuaries forbidden cloth-burning ritual at funerals
