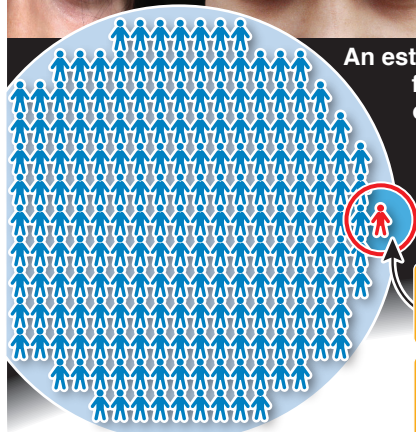


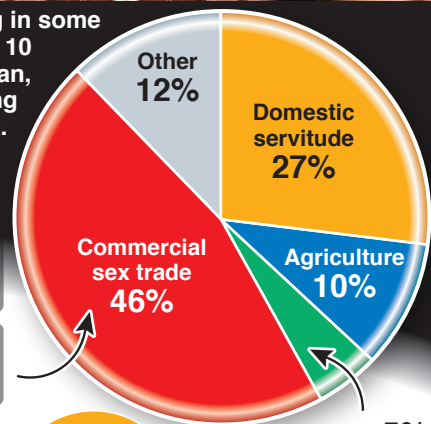
Modern-day slavery on the rise



An estimated 36 million people are living in some form of modern slavery, and six in 10 of them live in India, China, Pakistan, Uzbekistan, and Russia, according to the 2014 Global Slavery Index. Illegal profits from modern slavery are estimated at \$150 billion a year

One in every 200 people is exploited as a slave. 600,000-800,000 people are trafficked each year

Seven in 10 female victims – including 1.2 million children – are working in commercial sex trade
