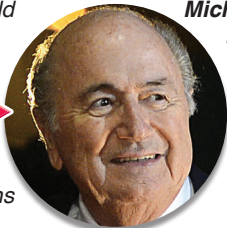
Luis Figo (Portugal). World Player of Year 2001, aims to rebuild trust in game
