Jordan vows retaliation against IS militants

Jordan's armed forces have promised that air strikes launched against Islamic State (IS) targets in Iraq and Syria are "just the beginning" of the country's retaliation for the killing of a captured Jordanian pilot

HOSTAGE TIMELINE

- Dec 24, 2014: Jordanian pilot Lt. Muath al-Kasasbeh captured by IS after his plane crashes in Syria
- Jan 20, 2015: IS threatens to kill two Japanese hostages unless Japan pays \$200m ransom within 72 hours
- Jan 24: IS releases video claiming it has killed Japanese hostage *Haruna Yukawa*. Group calls for release of *Sajida al-Rishawi* Iraqi militant sentenced to death in Jordan
- Jan 28: Jordan offers to release Rishawi in exchange for Kasasbeh
- Jan 31: IS video shows body of Japanese hostage *Kenji Goto*
- Feb 3: Video appears to show Kasasbeh burnt alive in cage. Jordanian media suggests he was killed weeks earlier
- Feb 4: Jordan executes Rishawi and second prisoner
