Cyprus deal allows Russian navy to use ports

Cyprus has signed a deal with Russia allowing its navy ships to make regular port calls on the EU island member state. The agreement comes amid strong tensions between Russia and the West over Ukraine



- Limassol: Port already used by Russian ships for refuelling and as transit station for supply of arms to Syrian President Bashar al-Assad
- Airports: Russian military aircraft able to use *Papandreou Air Base*, adjacent to *Paphos International Airport*, for humanitarian efforts

National Guard has replaced many
of its French *AMX-30* tanks with
Russian-made *T-80*, and purchased
11 Russian *Mi-35* attack helicopters
