
Modi to counter China in Indian Ocean

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi is to offer wide-ranging military and civilian assistance to Indian Ocean island states in a bid to wrest back some influence China has gained in those nations in recent years

Sri Lanka: Modi expected to tighten defence cooperation and push for final approval for 500 MW power plant to be built by Indian staterun energy firm in strategic port of Trincomalee

New President *Maithripala Sirisena* is reviewing infrastructure contracts previous government awarded to China, including \$1.5bn port city project in Colombo. China is Sri Lanka's top investor, biggest government
