


such as tax credits, universal credit, social housing or child benefit for dependents living outside UK

- Remove those that have failed to find work within six months
- Renegotiate EU rules on free movement of workers
- Bring net migration down to below 100,000 people a year



- Controls to stop low-skilled immigrants top talent only
- New law to prevent employers undercutting wages by using immigrants. Ban on agencies from recruiting only from abroad
- Migrants to wait two years before claiming benefits
- Fines for employing illegal immigrants to be increased



Liberal Democrats: Universal credit for migrants only after working for six months



- will only be paid for six months
- Benefits such as tax credits should only be paid to migrants working for equivalent of 35-hour week on minimum wage



- Migrants only entitled to permanent residence after 10 years
- Cut net migration down to 50,000 people a year

SNP: Scotland's devolved government to have control over immigration. Look at ways to attract high-skilled immigrants



Plaid Cymru

Plaid Cymru: Allow asylum seekers to work in Wales while they wait for status decisions to be made. Shut detention centres



■ Greens: Reduce immigration controls. Illegal migrants can stay in UK after five years. More legal rights for asylum seekers
