Banning Orders used to outlaw groups that incite hatred or cause fear

Extremism Disruption Orders (EXDOs) to stop “disruptive” individuals from speaking in public or holding positions of authority

New laws for police to monitor internet activity by suspected criminals

Replace Human Rights Act with British Bill of Rights



Labour: Scrap Police and Crime Commissioners and save £50m

Local residents to be given a say in deciding crime fighting priorities

Ban convicted child sex offenders from working with children

More money for police to prevent cuts in officer numbers

Bring back control orders to combat extremism and revive Prevent strategy

New commissioner on domestic and sexual abuse

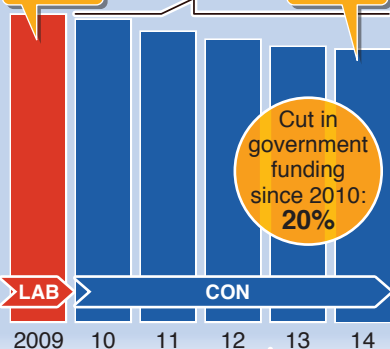
Greens: Scrap prison sentences for possession of drugs, decriminalise cannabis. Decriminalise prostitution
