
Party pledges: Welfare



- Cut housing benefits for under 21year-olds on Jobseeker's Allowance
- Benefits for pensioners, such as free bus passes, TV licences for over 75s and the winter fuel allowance protected

Labour: Raise minimum wage from £6.50-an-hour to £8 by 2020

- Freeze energy prices until 2017
- Extend 1% cap on child benefit rises to 2017
 - Repeal so-called "bedroom tax"
- Increase paid paternity leave
- to new fathers from two to four weeks
- Winter fuel allowance scrapped for wealthiest pensioners

taxed as well Cut benefits for pensioners on 40% rate of income tax

Freeze working-age

benefits only if rich are

- "Yellow card" system to deal with benefit claimants breaking rules, rather
- than sanctions without warning

 UKIP: Only pay child
 benefit for the first two
- children for new claimants

 Prevent anyone taking up
 permanent residence in Britain
 unless they're able to support
 themselves and dependents for
 at least five years, and stop them
 receiving benefits

SNPX

SNP: Oppose cuts to in-work benefits. Extend paternity leave. Protect policies such as concessionary travel for older people



Plaid Cymru

Plaid Cymru: Oppose new means testing for child-related benefits. Continue to campaign for "living pension" for those aged 80 and over



Greens: "Citizen's Income" of £72 a week paid to all, whether in work or not. Ban "zero hours" contracts.
Scrap "bedroom tax"
