▲ **South Vietnam surrendered unconditionally as Saigon fell to communist North Vietnamese forces, ending the longest conflict of the 20th century**

1815: The Kingdom of Poland, under Alexander of Russia, was created by the Congress of Vienna

1945: Adolf Hitler and Eva Braun, his wife of one day, committed suicide in his underground bunker in Berlin

1980: Terrorists seized the Iranian embassy in London, demanding the release of political prisoners in Iran
